- o Key Points from Cathy Williams' Presentation

 of the parties involved, such as the pooling of money by Black individuals to purchase
 land as an association.
 - Relationships and Community Interactions: Land records help understand family and community relationships, including interactions with white elites and municipal authorities.
 - Gender and Legal Rights: Carolyn highlighted the different ways women were treated in land records, noting that single women were often not permitted to own property in their own name.
 - Case Studies: Carolyn presented several case studies, including the Harvey family in Pasquetank County, detailing their land acquisitions and management.
 - Generational Wealth: The creation of generational wealth through real estate investments
 was discussed, with examples of families using land records to build and maintain wealth
 across generations.
 - Full Text Search in FamilySearch: Carolyn shared her experience using the full text search feature in FamilySearch, which significantly sped up her land record research.
 - Conclusion: Carolyn emphasized the importance of preserving family stories with accuracy and integrity and encouraged attendees to continue researching and documenting their family histories.
